


Foxcubs Reception pupils have been learning about doubles and combining groups in maths. We have been using Numicon to support our understanding and have completed some tasks in our maths books. In English, we have begun learning about traditional tales and focused on the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Some of us, made puppets from the story and retold the tale in our own words. In Year 1 English, we have



been reading about a giant doodle and even created our own giant doodle in the hall! We seguenced the story and made a class story map. In maths, we have been learning about doubles

Otters began their history topic last week all about travel and transport in the past. They looked at some of the earliest forms of transport and tried to put them on a timeline. They then learnt about



Viking longships and the various parts on them. In English Year 2 started working on the text Bonkers about Beetroot and all smiled when the zebra turned purple. While Year 1 enjoyed the magical element of Daisy Doodles and thoroughly enjoyed going to the hall for a giant doodle session. We have all been super impressed with the children's continued efforts to read at home - Monday's reading assembly is always a joy with reading certificates and prizes galore - well done everyone and keep

Hares Hares have returned to school with lots of enthusiasm for their new areas of learning. In music they are getting in the groove of Bob Marley's reggae and learning 'Three Little Birds'. PE will cover sessions in dance and orienteering; the theme for dance being the skeleton and we already have some jangly moves being created. In English we are learning how to survive in the rainforest and this will challenge the children to write personal diary entries and formal letters. Having completed our learning about length and finding out about perimeter in maths, we move onto Fractions (cake will be in the lessons at some point!). We also have a brilliant new class read by Michael Morpurgo 'Farm Boy' - we couldn't have a more fitting reading for our class.



Badgers In Badgers' Class, we have been learning how to accurately punctuate and use relative clauses in English. They have a super impact on our writing. In maths, we have been rehearsing rounding decimals to the nearest whole number. This is not as easy as it sounds and we have been challenged this week! Our Science area of study this term is Living Things and their Habitats. We are looking forward to learning how animals are adapted to suit their environments. We ended our week with a 'REALLY FUN' lesson from Mrs. Williamson, where we have been experimenting creating space backgrounds

similar to the backgrounds with the artist Robert T McCall's artwork.

Stags have started many new topics in earnest, kicking off a look into our history unit on leisure and entertainment during the 20th century. We will be looking at how holidays, sports, cinema, and TV among many other things have evolved and changed over the period and how this compares to their experiences. We have also started our science unit on electricity and will be building and learning about circuits with a view to incorporating what we learn into our DT project for this term. Our English sequence is fiction-based where we will be attempting to write in the style of the brilliant Shaun Tan, using the model text 'Undertow' as an example of his great skill.
