Recently, cases of head lice have been identified across the school and we wanted to make sure you were kept informed.

Whilst lice are nothing more than a nuisance, it is important that children are checked on a weekly basis so that any head lice can be dealt with quickly and before they are allowed to spread.

We ask that all families check children's hair as soon as possible.

Here is some simple advice you may wish to follow to keep head lice outbreaks to a minimum

- Check your child's hair once a week
- Use a proper detection comb with teeth no more than 0.3mm apart to trap head lice
- If you find live lice, consult a pharmacist and check the whole family.



Foxcubs A highlight for all of us was world book day. Badgers class read our stories to us, we

took part in the costume parade in assembly and some teachers shared their favourite stories with us too. We also read 'Room on the Broom' and completed lots of room on the broom activities in class.

In Reception, we have continued learning about traditional tales. So far, we have focussed on 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' and 'The Three Little Pigs'. In maths, we have been thinking about the numbers 9 and 10.





Otters have been busy completing some assessments over the last two weeks and it has been



really pleasing to see how they have approached these. All the children have really tried hard to remain focussed and show off what they have learnt - well done everyone! Alongside this Otters have been busy learning more about the history or travel and transport, thinking about how flight has developed and how cars have changed over time. All the children enjoyed watching the failed attempts of many inventors who tried to take to the skies and could see how they all tried to include wings in

their designs. A big thank you for your continued support with your child's reading at home - there is a real buzz around the children who love earning the various certificates. Many of the children are trying hard to earn their 100 reads certificate and get an elusive fist pump with Mr Johnston!

Hares thoroughly embraced the recent whole school World Book Day event, and threw themselves in to the reading activities we organised. Their costumes were fabulous too! Hares are enjoying finding out about balanced diets in science and investigating the nutrients that can be found in different foods. We even planned a day's worth of healthy meals for an athlete! We are well into our fractions unit in maths and have enjoyed researching endangered rainforest animals in English.





Badgers have been enjoying their science topic of 'Living things and their habitats'. We have learnt about grouping and classifying living things and how to create a classification key. We started practising our skills by finding ways to classify biscuits and then moved on to using more scientific criteria to classify animals. We are also really enjoying our Topic learning about 'Crime and Punishment'. The children have enjoyed finding out about the strange laws and punishments of the past- we're very glad these don't exist anymore!

Stags worked very hard through assessment week to complete all of their tests – the Year 6 pupils

especially getting some important experience of the SATs tests that they will encounter in May. Look out for a SATs meeting for parents of Year 6 pupils to prepare you for what to expect in May - the children know it is not something to be worried about, but it is a unique and important week in the school calendar that we recognise that you will want to know more about. Stags' Class have some great projects up and running this term, our electricity understanding is allowing us to now comfortably make circuits, understand conductors and insulators and use circuit symbols accurately. We are currently in the midst of writing our stories around unusual discoveries found in everyday places - we have had fun coming up with some great ideas that are coming into good frui-

tion. In history, we have just looked at music through the 20th century – the pupils identified the 90s as their favourite decade – which one would be yours?

Superb effort and attitude from all. Thank you Miss. Loader for coaching the team!




A fantastic Homework Share in Badgers' Class last week. Well done everyone for all your hard work! Superb!
